Program Overview:

The Recent Advances in Clinical Medicine (RACM) conference is the University of Virginia Department of Medicine's flagship continuing medical education program, designed to provide clinicians with timely, evidence-based updates across major internal medicine subspecialties. The course features expert-led sessions spanning cardiology, gastroenterology, infectious diseases, endocrinology, pulmonology/critical care, nephrology, hematology/oncology, geriatrics, palliative care, and general internal medicine. The program emphasizes clinically relevant updates, guideline changes, diagnostic strategies, and therapeutic advances, with a focus on improving patient outcomes in both primary and specialty care settings.

Desired Outcomes

At the conclusion of this program, participants will be able to:

- Evaluate and manage incidental findings using evidence-based diagnostic strategies
- Integrate multidisciplinary care strategies into clinical practice to improve patient outcomes
- Incorporate emerging therapies into patient care.
- Recognize when specialty referral is indicated
