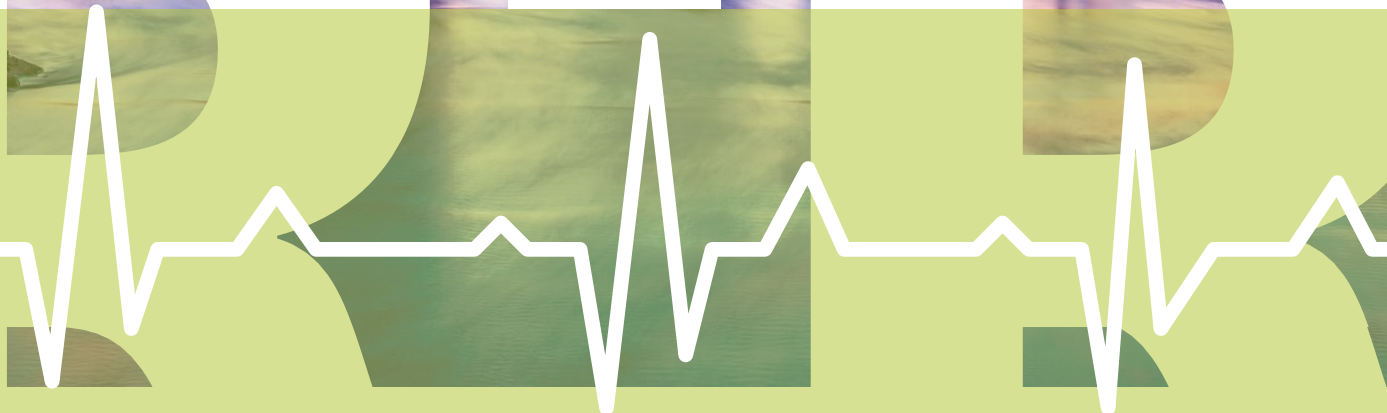

# PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Virginia Cardiovascular Specialists invites you to attend Rhythm in Richmond, our biennial program designed to provide physicians and APP's with the most current information on cardiac arrhythmias. This year's program will focus on key areas such as managing syncope and palpitations; ECG interpretation; a review of cardiac rhythm devices, monitors, and wearables; and atrial fibrillation management, including ablation and anticoagulation. There will also be presentations on sleep apnea management and GLP-1 therapy and the potential cardiovascular impact.
